Look Forward to More Convenience and Connections

We are working to improve transport connections in Bukit Panjang to allow smoother traffic flow and quicker access to destinations. This includes better Walk Cycle Ride options for residents. Please look out for **the first phase of changes** taking place from **3 Apr 2022**:

- Parts of Senja Road and Senja Link changed to one-way traffic.
- Bus route changes affecting Senja Close and Petir Road.
There will be route changes to Services 920, 972, 972M, 976, while Service 971 will be removed.

By the **end of 2022**, residents can look forward to better connections between Senja Road and Kranji Expressway (KJE), as well as more covered linkways and cycling paths.

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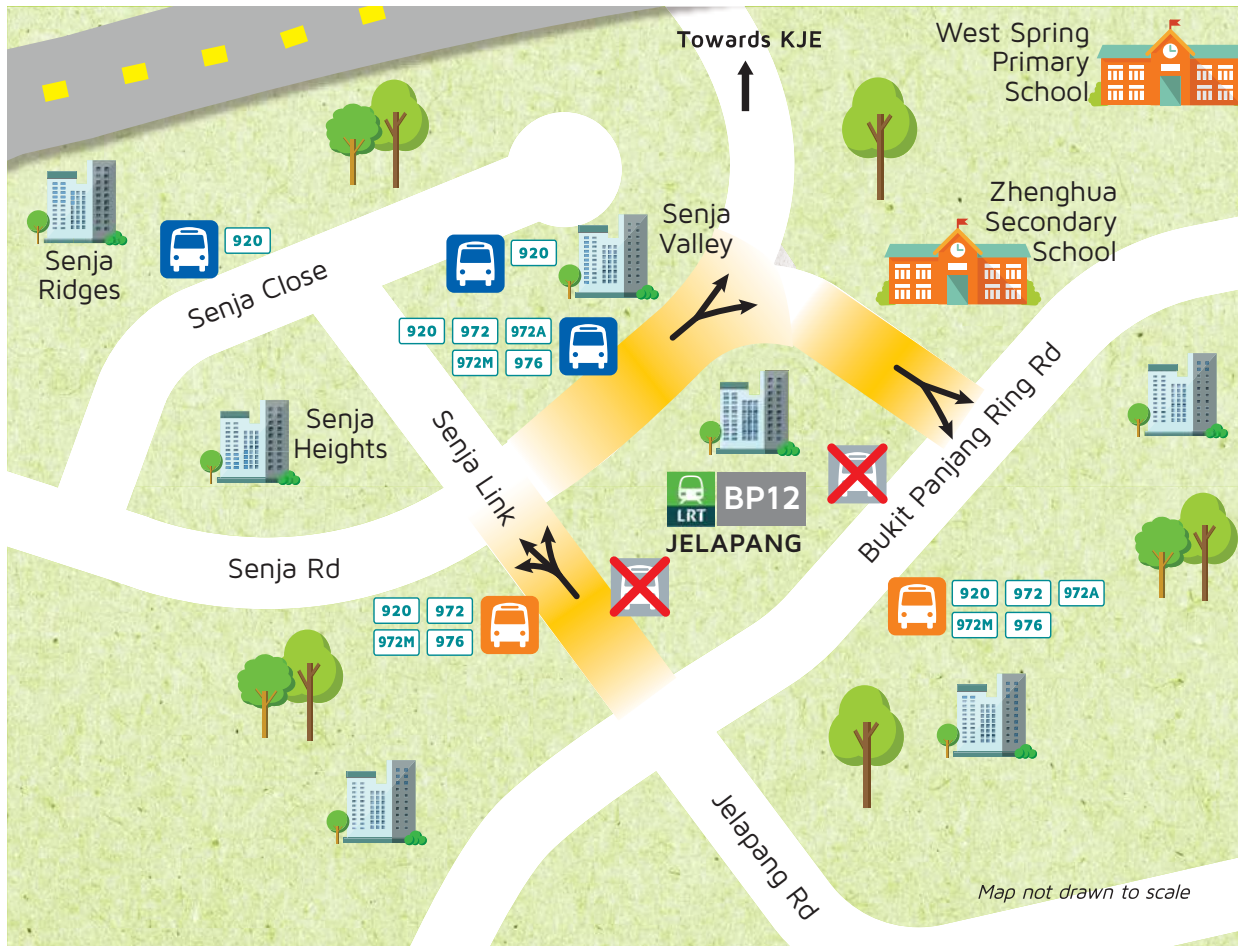
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Senja Road & Senja Link: Changes to Road Directions and Bus Stops with effect from 3 Apr 2022

Parts of Senja Road and Senja Link will be converted to one-way traffic from 3 April 2022. When works are completed in end-2022, only the stretch of Senja Road towards Kranji Expressway will resume two-way traffic.

Bus Stop Changes

With the changes to one-way traffic, please look out for bus stops which are added or removed. Existing bus stop 44829 along Senja Link will be shifted closer to Bukit Panjang Ring Road in 3Q2022.

Bus Services & Route Changes with effect from 3 Apr 2022

Bus Service 920

Service 920 will now travel along Senja Close to serve residents in the new HDB developments. With part of Senja Link becoming a one-way road, Service 920 will ply Senja Road after serving Senja Close, followed by the original route along Jelapang Road. When returning to Bukit Panjang Integrated Transport Hub, Service 920 will enter and loop around the cul-de-sac at Senja Close to serve residents in the new housing developments.



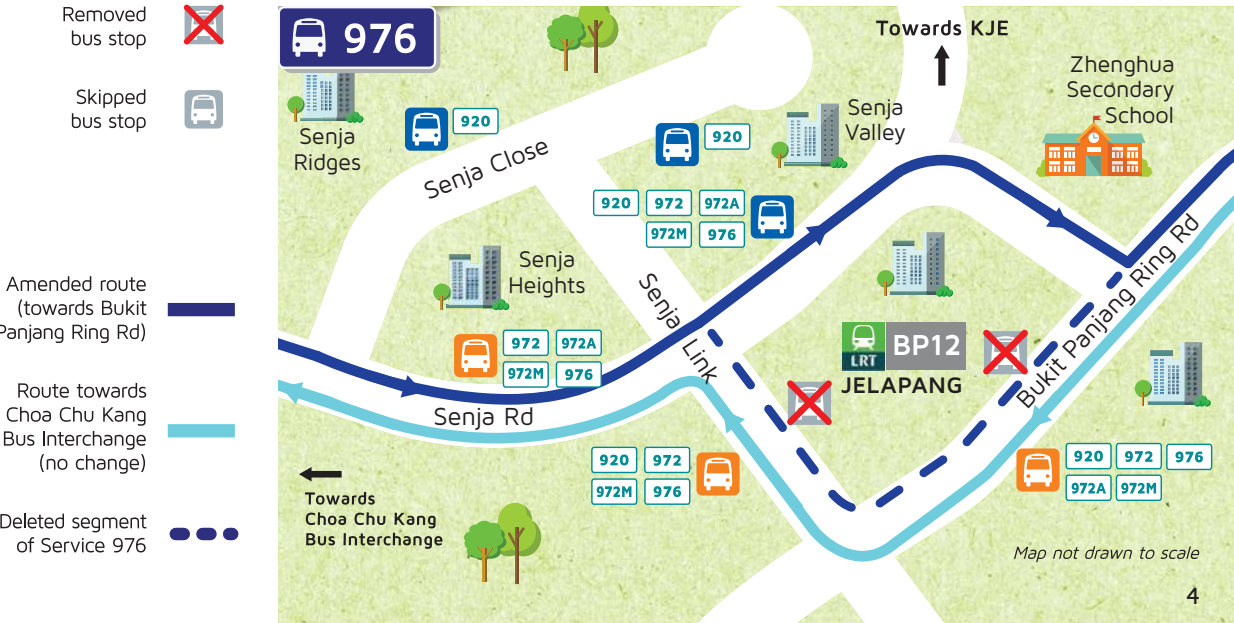
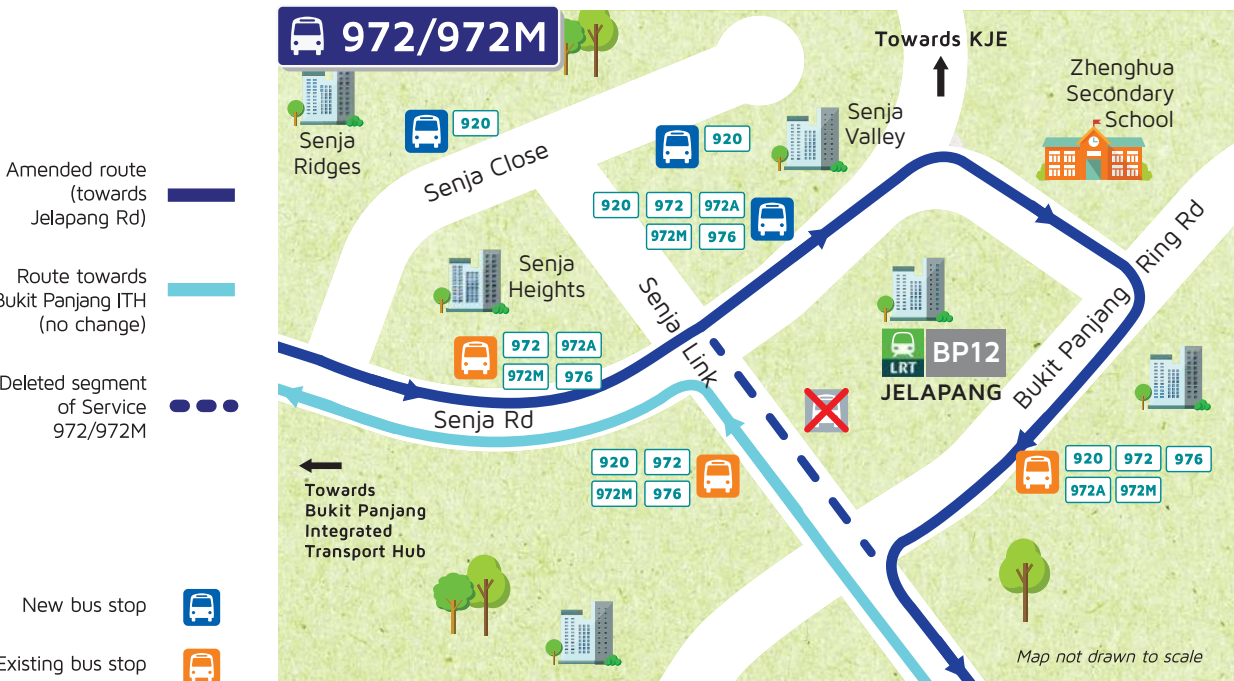

Bus Services & Route Changes with effect from 3 Apr 2022

Bus Service 972/972M and 976

Service 972/972M towards Jelapang Road and Service 976 towards Bukit Panjang Ring Road will follow the new one-way traffic on Senja Road.

There will be no changes to the return routes of Service 972/972M towards Bukit Panjang Integrated Transport Hub, and to Choa Chu Kang Bus Interchange for Service 976.

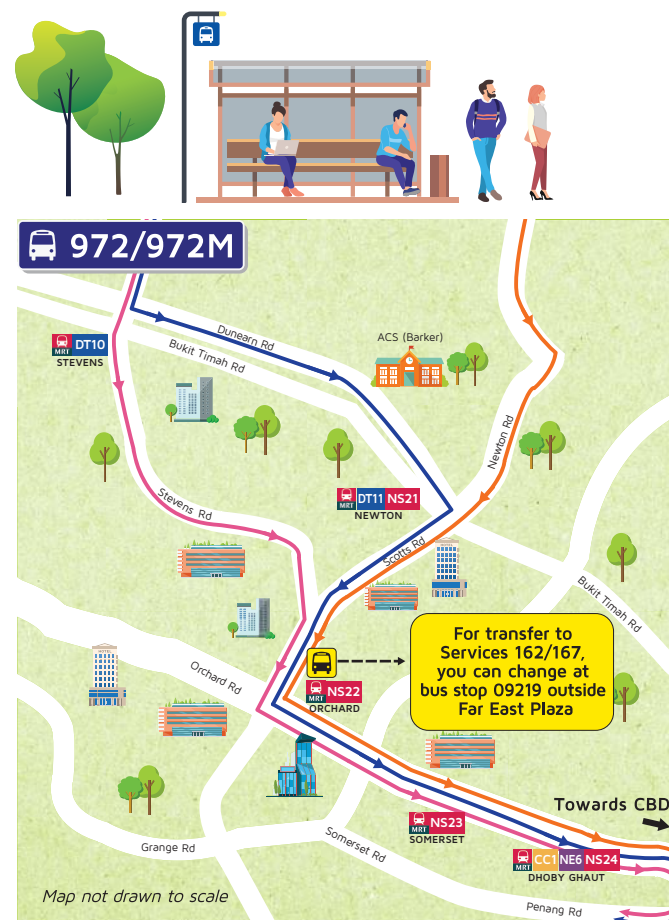
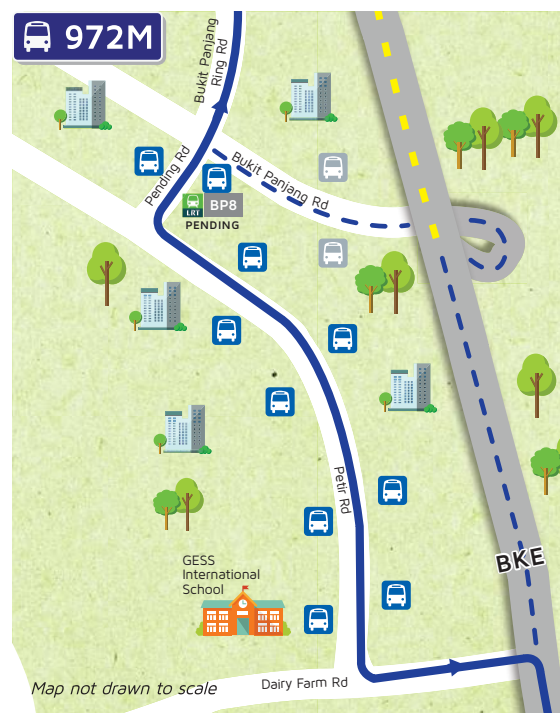
Bus Service 972M Amended to Serve Pending Road and Petir Road

In addition to route changes to follow the new one-way traffic flow in Senja, Service 972M will also be amended to serve residents along Pending Road and Petir Road.

Bus Service 971 Discontinued from 4 Apr 2022

Service 971, which used to only run during weekday peak hours, will be discontinued.

For travel towards town, residents can take Services 972 or 972M which run throughout the day. For travel towards Shenton Way, you can change to Services 162 or 167 along Scotts Road and Orchard Road. Apart from taking a bus, you can also ride the MRT to travel to town or Shenton Way.

Senja Road & Kranji Expressway: New Flyover & Roads by end-2022

Currently, vehicles can only make a left turn from Senja Road onto Kranji Expressway (KJE)'s westbound lanes towards PIE and Tuas. There is also no direct exit from KJE onto Senja Road.

By end-2022, new flyover and road connections between Senja Road and KJE will be completed:

- Vehicles from Senja Road can enter KJE in both east- and westbound directions.
- Vehicles travelling along both directions along KJE can exit directly onto Senja Road.

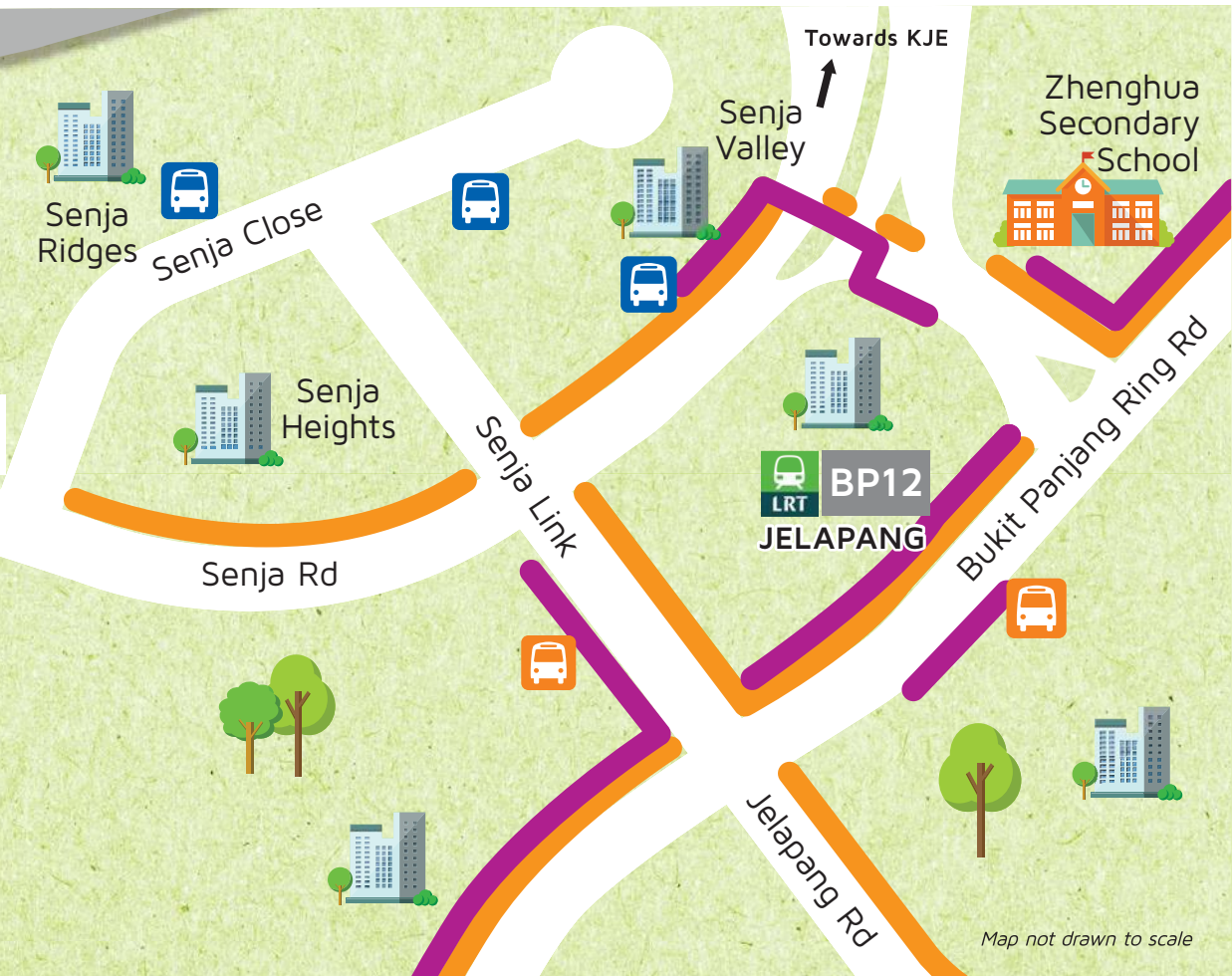


Current traffic flow

More Covered Linkways & Cycling Paths by end-2022

Residents can look forward to a more comprehensive network of covered linkways and cycling paths around Jelapang LRT Station. They will be built progressively and completed by the end of 2022. The cycling paths will connect to a broader cycling network across Bukit Panjang.
