




The Polytechnic Experience!

I signed up for a week-long course on Chemical Engineering at Singapore Polytechnic. The course started at 9 am and ended at 5 pm. Amongst the insights I gained were those shared by the lecturers who told us that many people entered the course thinking that it focuses on the domain of chemistry and did not think much of the engineering part, which is the mathematics part. For example, on the first day, we were taught how to convert between the metric system and the American customary system. I was also given a preview of the machines, materials and the concepts associated with the industry. It was a worthwhile experience for I was given the opportunity to find out from the lecturers, the industries I could enter given the experience I may gain while working in the chemical engineering industry.

The course too provided a few friends of mine and me the opportunity to experiment with the machines that make the agar jelly firm and machines that manufacture different versions of hand cream. We got to test how spreadable the creams were.



The activities lined up by the lecturers are definitely something to look forward to. I would strongly encourage anyone interested in getting a foretaste of a tertiary education, to sign up for such courses as they give you the opportunity to find out more about the course requirements and the environment you will be learning in. The courses offered provide us with insights on future job opportunities. It serves as a stepping stone for anyone wishing to continue in the course should he or she succeed in qualifying for a spot after the national examinations results are released. The AEM module was truly very enriching and informative.
